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A Minority Majority Nation

- ▶ The 2010 US Census, Pew Research Center, and USHLI have recently published studies indicating the US will become a minority majority nation by 2042.
- ▶ Latinos have become and will be the main driving force in bringing about this transformation.

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2010 US Hispanic Population

- ▶ In 2010, the Latino population totaled 50.5 million.
- ▶ Hispanics made up 16.3% of the U.S. population.

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Recent US Hispanic Population Growth

- ▶ From 2000 to 2010, the Latino population increased by 43.0%, while the non-Latino population increased by 4.9%.
- ▶ From 2000 to 2010, the Hispanic population increased by 15.2 million.

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US Hispanic Population Growth

- ▶ The Latino population increased by 7 million between 1980 and 1990.
- ▶ By 13 million between 1990 to 2000.
- ▶ By 15 million between 2000 to 2010.

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US Hispanic Population Expected Growth

- ▶ The Latino population is expected to exceed 66 million by 2020.
- ▶ As a result, the Hispanic population is expected to exceed 20% of the US total population by 2020.

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US Hispanic Population Long Term Growth

- ▶ By 2050, the U.S. Census Bureau projects that the Latino population will grow to 132.8 million.
- ▶ By 2050, Hispanics will constitute 30.2% of the U.S. population.

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US Hispanic Immigration Population

- ▶ The Latin American immigrant population is in all 50 states but has distributed primarily in the following six states:
 - California (25.8%)
 - Texas (14.2%)
 - Florida (13.0%)
 - New York (10.2%)
 - New Jersey (4.0%)
 - Illinois (4.0%)

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US Hispanic Population Citizenship

- ▶ 73.8% of Latinos were citizens of the United States.
- ▶ 85.3% were native born, while 14.7% were naturalized.
- ▶ 26.1% of Latinos were foreign born not citizens of the US.

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US Hispanic Population English Skills

- ▶ Of Latino Spanish-speakers 5-years of age and older, 53.3% spoke English "very well."
- ▶ 18.6% spoke English "well."
- ▶ 18.2% spoke English "not well."
- ▶ 10.0% spoke English "not at all."

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US Hispanic Population Median Age

- ▶ The median age of Latinos was 27.2 years, compared to 42.1 years for Whites.
- ▶ 33.9% of US Hispanics were under 18 years of age compared to 20.1% of Whites.

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US Hispanic Population Education

- ▶ Of Latinos 25-years of age and older, 37.8% had less than a high school diploma compared to 9.3% of Whites.

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US Hispanic Population Education

- ▶ 26.5% had a high school diploma, or GED compared to 29.3% of Whites.
- ▶ 22.7% had some college or an Associate's degree compared to 30.0% of Whites.

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US Hispanic Population Education

- ▶ 8.9% had a Bachelor's degree compared to 19.7% of Whites.
- ▶ 4.1% had a Graduate degree compared to 11.7% of Whites.

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US Hispanic Population Income

- ▶ In 2010 inflation-adjusted dollars, the median household income totaled \$40,165 for Latinos and \$54,168 for Whites.

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US Hispanic Population Health Insurance

- ▶ 69.1% of Latinos were insured compared to 89.1% of Whites.
- ▶ 30.9% of Hispanics were uninsured compared to 10.9% of Whites.

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US Hispanic Population Home Ownership

- ▶ 49.6% of Latino households were owner occupied, compared to 75.5% of White households.
- ▶ 50.4% of Hispanic households were renter occupied, compared to 24.5% of White households.

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US Hispanic Population Employment

- ▶ 8.7% of Latinos were unemployed compared to 5.8% of Whites.

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US Life Tables

- ▶ 2010 Life Tables show life expectancy at birth in the US was 78.7 years, an increase of 0.2 years from the 78.5 years in 2009.
- ▶ Although slightly offset by increases in mortality from suicide, Alzheimer's disease, and chronic liver disease and cirrhosis, the report indicates that life expectancy increased because of decreases in mortality from heart disease, influenza and pneumonia, and cancer.

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US Life Expectancy

- ▶ In 2010, on average, a person aged 65 could expect to live an average of 19.1 more years for a total of 84.1 years.
- ▶ A person aged 85 could expect to live an additional 6.5 years for a total of 91.5 years.
- ▶ A person aged 100 could expect to live an additional 2.3 years for a total of 102.3 years.

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US Hispanic Life Expectancy

- ▶ In 2010, Hispanic females continued to have the highest life expectancy at 83.8 years.
- ▶ Non-Hispanic white females at 81.1 years.
- ▶ Hispanic males at 78.7 years.
- ▶ Non-Hispanic black females at 77.7 years.
- ▶ Non-Hispanic white males at 76.4 years.
- ▶ Non-Hispanic black males at 71.4 years.

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US Hispanic Top 15 Health Issues

- ▶ 1. Circulatory diseases such as hypertension and heart disease.
- ▶ 2. General preventive care such as common cold or flu.
- ▶ 3. Musculoskeletal problems such as back pain or arthritis.
- ▶ 4. Respiratory issues like pneumonia and asthma.
- ▶ 5. Endocrine problems such as high cholesterol and diabetes.

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US Hispanic Top 15 Health Issues

- ▶ 6. Nervous system diseases like Alzheimer's and epilepsy.
- ▶ 7. Cancers and tumors.
- ▶ 8. Genitourinary problems like kidney issues.
- ▶ 9. Injury and poisoning, including auto and work accidents.
- ▶ 10. Digestive issues like heartburn, diarrhea, and incontinence.

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US Hispanic Top 15 Health Issues

- ▶ 11. Mental illness such as dementia and depression.
- ▶ 12. Infectious diseases like tuberculosis and hepatitis.
- ▶ 13. Dermatological disorders such as eczema and psoriasis.
- ▶ 14. Pregnancy and childbirth.
- ▶ 15. Other problems.
